This is your opportunity to improve the value of your property while developing wildlife habitat, minimizing erosion, and enjoying the beauty of the natural world!

What are seedlings, transplants, rooted clumps and dormant plants?

A seedling is a bare root tree or shrub. We carry one, two and three year seedlings, depending on if it's a conifer, hardwood or shrub. Seedlings are shipped while dormant, without a root ball or soil, but are covered in a moist material or root dipped to retain moisture. A transplant is a seedling grown for a year or two, then replanted to another bed to allow for development of a fibrous root system and more branching. A rooted clump is a dormant rooted plant without top growth. It may not have leafing, but is ready to grow!

Red Maple

A common ornamental tree and staple of the eastern United States, Red Maple will liven up your yard with brightly colored fruits and flowers, in addition to its stunning fall foliage. The fastest growing maple, Red Maple is easy to establish and is able to grow in virtually any conditions. (Page 6)



Steeplebush

This deciduous shrub can grow up to 10 feet tall, and produces beautiful plumes of pink or rose-purple flowers. This shrub becomes dense and erect, and grows in clusters, making it perfect for attracting butterflies in the summer. Watch for its stunning yellow fall foliage, too. (Page 5)




Balsam Fir

Commonly used for Christmas trees, this small to medium sized conifer grows symmetrically and in whorls. This tree does best in cold, moist climates and should be planted in an area not prone to lots of wind. (Page 4)



Yellow Birch

A strong, hardy tree, Yellow Birch is used for furniture, cabinetry, doors, and more. The wood can be stained and takes a high polish. The seeds attract a variety of songbirds, in addition to grouse and some small mammals. The bark and fall leaves make for a showy yard view. This tall, slow growing tree does best in full sun. (Page 7).



New Mix for Native Flowering Pack

Featuring last years' 2 Elderberries, 2 Eastern Redbuds, 2 Black Chokeberries, and 2 White Flowering Dogwoods, this pack has now added 2 Nannyberries. These plants provide beautiful colors and ample food for wildlife! (Page 10)



New Mix for Hosta Pack

This multipack contains 2 of each species with last years' Fortunei-Hyacinthina, F. Aureo marginata, Variegated Hosta Undulata albo, and Variegated Hosta Ventricosa. New to the mix is Hadspen Blue. These popular perennials are a must have! (Page 11)



CONIFERS

Balsam Fir

(Abies balsamea) **Native**
Slow growth rate, up to 60 feet tall. It is commonly used for lumber and Christmas trees. This species is shade tolerant and grows best in medium soils.

10-18" transplants.

Price: \$23/10 pack; \$105/50 pack; \$190/100 pack



Colorado Blue Spruce

(Picea pungens) **Non-Native**
Slow growth rate, up to 100 feet. Prefers moist, acidic, well-drained soils with partial to full sun. Primarily used for screens, windbreaks, and Christmas trees. Sharp needles with a bluish tint.

Douglas Fir

(Pseudotsuga menziesii) **Non-Native**
This conifer can grow up to 100 feet tall. It is commonly use for lumber and Christmas trees. This species grows best in medium to wet, well-drained soils with full sun.

Eastern White Pine

(Pinus strobus) **Native**
This rapid growing conifer can reach up to 150 feet. It has long, soft needles and seeds that songbirds and squirrels love. This species is shade tolerant and can survive in a wide range of soil moisture conditions.

10-16'' transplants.

Fraser Fir

(Abies fraseri) **Non-Native**
This stately tree is commonly used for Christmas tree production and wildlife benefits. With a moderate growth rate reaching 50 feet., shiny dark-green needles, a distinctive bark and dense pyramidal shape it, is a popular choice. It grows best in cool moist soils.

10-18'' transplants.

Norway Spruce

(Picea abies) **Naturalized**
Slow to moderate growth rate, up to 130 feet. Prefers moist, acidic, well-drained soils with partial to full sun (does not tolerate poorly drained soils). Primarily used for windbreaks, ornamental plantings, and sometimes Christmas trees.

Dark green needles.

15+'' seedling.

Compost mulch will be available at the ecopark during both the Tree and Shrub pre-order distribution and overstock sale.

This is a great source for you to obtain excellent nutrients and cover for your plantings! However, mulch should not be used in vegetable gardens. Residents must bring their own containers and a shovel to collect and bring home compost mulch.

CONIFERS CONTINUED

White Spruce

(*Picea glauca*) Native

Slow to moderate growth rate, up to 100 feet. Prefers moist, well-drained soils and is shade tolerant. It is not tolerant of winter salt spray, dry soils, and heat. Primarily used for lumber, windbreaks, Christmas trees, screens and wildlife habitat. Green needles, with pungent odor when crushed.

DECIDUOUS SHRUBS

Buttonbush

(*Cephalanthus occidentalis*) Native

Deciduous shrub growing up to 10 feet tall that produces unique flowers in early summer to attract butterflies. It does best in full to partial sun and medium to wet moisture.

Steeplebush

(*Spiraea tomentosa*) Native

Deciduous shrub growing up to 10 feet tall that produces unique flowers in early summer to attract butterflies. It does best in full to partial sun and medium to wet moisture.


American Hazelnut

(*Corylus americana*) Native

Moderate growth rate, up to 10 feet. Prefers sun to partial shade and rich, moist, well-drained soils. Cultivated for nut production. Also provides habitat and food to wildlife. Broadly oval deciduous leaves.

10-18'' seedling.

American Sycamore

(*Platanus occidentalis*) Native

Rapid growth rate, up to 100 feet. Prefers moist, deep, rich soils with full sun, but is very adaptable to dry, wet, compacted, and poor soil conditions. Creates wildlife habitat. Has a large, broad, open crown, with crooked branches. Bark is attractively mottled.

12-18'' seedling.

Black Cherry

(*Prunus serotina*) Native

Rapid growth rate, up to 80 feet. Prefers moist, rich, moderately-well drained soils, but will tolerate a variety of soil types, textures, and drainages with partial or full sun. Provides habitat & food for wildlife. Flowers are small and white.

Black Walnut

(*Juglans nigra*) Native

Rapid growth rate up to 100 feet.. Prefers full sun and most soil types. Large nuts provide habitat for wildlife and are edible, typically maturing in late September. This is the most valuable wood producing tree in all of North America. Should not be planted near other trees.

DECIDUOUS TREES CONTINUED

Eastern Redbud

(*Cercis canadensis*) **Native**
 Slow growth rate, up to 40 feet.
 Does well in most amounts of shade and soil types. This tree provides great aesthetic value to your property with its bright pink flowers that bloom in early spring.
 10-18" seedling.

**Persimmon**

(*Diospyros virginiana*) **Native**
 Slow growth rate, up to 55 feet..
 Prefers sun to partial shade and dry to medium soil moisture.
 Drought tolerant. Provides habitat and food to wildlife. Glossy, dark green, oval leaves that turn yellow in the fall.

12-18" seedling.

Red Maple

(*Acer rubrum*) **Native**
 Rapid growth rate, up to 70 feet.
 Considered a "supergeneralist," this species is tolerant of a variety of soil types and conditions, but most abundant in bottomlands, able to withstand heavy flooding and disturbance. One of the most popular ornamentals, it produces stunning foliage, food for wildlife, and bright flowers.

**Red Oak**

(*Quercus rubra*) **Native**
 Moderate growth rate, up to 80 feet. Prefers well drained soils, but is very adaptable to many different soil types and drainages. Prefers full to partial sun. Primarily used for lumber and providing habitat and a food resource for wildlife.

River Birch

(*Betula nigra*) **Native**
 Rapid growth rate, up to 70 feet.
 Prefers full to partial sun and medium to wet soil moisture conditions. Tolerates poorly drained soils. Great for erosion control. Has diamond shaped, dark-green leaves that turn yellow in the fall. Bark on young trees is light brown in color and paper-like.

Sugar Maple*(Acer saccharum)* **Native**

The state tree of New York, it has a slow growth rate, up to 80 feet. Prefers full to partial sun but is heavy shade tolerant. Does well in medium moisture and well drained soils. This tree's leaves turns bright red in the fall.


Rapid growth rate, up to 100 feet. Prefers medium moisture conditions and well-drained soils with full sun. Makes a great shade tree for sunny yards. Leaves turn bright red in fall.

Price: \$16/10 pack; \$70/50 pack**White Flowering Dogwood***(Cornus florida)* **Native**

Moderate growth rate, up to 30 feet. Prefers moist, well drained soils and full to partial sun. Produces white showy flowers in late spring that attract pollinators such as butterflies. Bright red fruits provide food for birds.


Slow growth rate, up to 100 feet. Prefers moist, well drained, slightly acidic soils with partial to full sunlight but is very adaptable to many different soil types and drainages. Provides habitat & food for wildlife.

Price: \$17/10 pack; \$75/50 pack**Yellow Birch***(Betula alleghaniensis)* **Native**

Slow growth rate, up to 75 feet. Prefers moist, well drained soils with full sunlight. This hardwood provides great wood for staining and polishing, and it's bark and fall foliage are quite the combination. The seeds attract a variety of songbirds, in addition to grouse and small mammals.

Planting and Storage Tips

- ❖ If storage is necessary, be sure to store your seedlings in a dark, cool area.
- ❖ Once in storage, check the moisture content of each bundle and sprinkle with water if necessary.
- ❖ **DO NOT SOAK SEEDLINGS FOR MORE THAN 30 MINUTES.**
- ❖ Plant your seedlings as soon as possible (This reduces mortality rates).
- ❖ Use a site that's been properly prepared (All sod should be removed). Be sure to consider sun and shade preferences for each plant as well as soils, drainage and pH before planting.
- ❖ Plant your seedlings at the proper depth and cover with mulch or weed mats.
- ❖ Water your seedlings and plants often.

Following these tips can greatly increase plant survival rates!

Edible Fruit Multi-Pack –

Plant pack contains 10 plants with two of each species. All of these plants produce fruit that is edible to humans and also enjoyed by wildlife. Blueberry, raspberry, and blackberry plants will be sold in dormant seedlings larger than 9 inches and strawberry plants sold as dormant rooted clumps.

Blackberry - 'Darrow'

(*Rubus darrow*) (*Eldorado x Brewer*) x *Hedrick* **Native**

Moderate growth rate, up to 5 feet. Prefers moist to well-drained, sandy loam soils with partial to full sun. Not tolerant to dry, hot conditions. Primarily used as a food resource by humans and wildlife (blackberries have record diameter of 1 inch). This hybrid bears its large fruit over a long season from late spring through early summer. Fruits are borne on second-year canes.



Blueberry - 'Blue Crop'

(*Vaccinium corymbosum*)

'Bluecrop' **Native**

The most widely planted mid-season producing blueberry cultivar in the world. It can produce high yields of medium sized blueberries. It is a disease resistant and cold-hardy blueberry plant produced by selective breeding. The plant can grow to a height of 6-8 feet. Blue crop blueberries are enjoyed by both humans and animals.

Blueberry - 'Jersey'

(*Vaccinium corymbosum*)

'Jersey' **Native**

A late season blueberry producing plant; It produces high yields of small blueberries. The plant is cold-hardy and can grow in a wide range of soils when compared to other blueberry cultivars. Jersey blueberries are also enjoyed by humans and animals.



Raspberry - 'Latham'

(*Rubus latham*) **Native**

This plant requires full sun to grow well. It typically flowers in the late spring and produces bright and tasty berries mid summer that are enjoyed by birds as well as humans. It grows to approximately 3-5 feet in height and has dark green leaves.

Strawberry - 'Jewel'

(*Fragaria ananassa*) **Native**

A common variety of strawberry that is widely grown and sold. Only reaching 12" in height, the berries are large and wedge shaped that are firm and abrasion resistant. This variety of strawberry is well known for its flavor and high quality berries. This plant also has longer yielding seasons than other strawberry plants. The flowers of the strawberry plant can attract pollinators while the plant and it's fruit are eaten by many animals.



Fern Plant Multi Pack –

Plant pack contains 10 plants with two of each species. All of these ferns are protected plants in New York. Plants will be sold as dormant rooted clumps.

Maidenhair Fern

(*Adiantum pedatum*)

Native

Moderate growth rate, up to 2.5 feet in height and 1.5 feet in width. Prefers moist, acidic soils, but will tolerate medium well-drained soils in partial shade to full shade. This perennial fern is finely-textured, with somewhat frilly fronds which have curved stalks and are palmately-divided.



Christmas Fern

(*Polystichum acrostichoides*)

Native

Moderate growth rate, up to 2 feet in height and 2 feet in width. Prefers moist, well-drained and acidic soils in partial to full shade. This perennial fern is evergreen, with dark-green characteristic "ear-like" lobes that point upwards. Most commonly found in woodlands.



New York Fern

(*Thelypteris noveboracensis*)

Native

Moderate growth rate, up to 1.5 feet in height. Prefers well-drained to poorly-drained soils in partial to full shade. This fern is a bright yellow-green with reddish brown scales.



Ostrich Fern

(*Matteuccia struthiopteris*)

Native

Moderate growth rate, up to 3 feet in height. Prefers moist soils with partial to full shade. This fern has a smooth, lance shaped pinnae and sharp pointed tips that are reduced at the base.



Cinnamon Fern

(*Osmundastrum cinnamomeum*)

Native

Moderate growth rate, up to 5 feet in height. Prefers poorly drained, wet acidic soils and in partial to full shade. This perennial fern gets its name because of the cinnamon-colored hairs covering its leaf stalks and reproductive bodies.



Native Flowering Tree & Shrub Multi-Pack –

Plant pack contains 10 plants with two of each species.

All plants in this pack will be sold in 18-24" dormant seedlings.

Black Chokeberry

(*Aronia melanocarpa*)

Native

Moderate growth rate, up to 12 feet. Prefers moderately drained soils with full sun. The berries are consumed by wildlife and humans. Flowers are white, blooming in May with fruit harvested in the fall.



Elderberry

(*Sambucus canadensis*)

Native

Rapid growth rate up to 10 feet. Prefers well drained to poorly drained soils and sunlight to shade. Attracts pollinating insects. Blooms white flowers in June and July followed by dark purple berries that are great for wildlife.

Nannyberry

(*Viburnum lentago*)

Native

This deciduous shrub grows up to 28 feet and does best in rich, moist soil types. A shade tolerant shrub that produces white blooms from May through June, it reaches its best height in more open areas.



Eastern Redbud

(*Cercis canadensis*)

Native

This tree can grow up to 30 feet tall. It grows well in full to partial sunlight and medium moisture, well-drained soils. In early spring it produces beautiful pink blooms.

White Flowering Dogwood

(*Cornus florida*)

Native

Moderate growth rate with a height up to 30 feet. Prefers well drained soil with partial sun. Striking display of white flowers when in full bloom in April and May.



Hosta Plant Variety Multi-Pack –

Plant pack contains 10 plants with two of each plant. Plants will be sold as dormant rooted clumps.

Price: \$22.00 per packet

Hosta

(Fortunei-Hyacinthina)

A selection great for mass plantings with broad, firm, heart-shaped leaves that are a deep gray-green on top and blue below. This Hosta has greater sun tolerance when compared to other Hosta varieties. Pale lavender flowers appear on 30" scapes in mid to late summer.



Hosta

(F. aureomarginata)

This Hosta has large mounds of wavy, green, pointed leaves that are both sun and drought tolerant. Fragrant, white flowers appear on 35-40" scapes in late summer; fragrance is most pronounced in the evening.

Hosta

Hadspen Blue

An easy growing hosta that prefers partial to full shade, this species blooms in late summer for the perfect time to attract hummingbirds. Flowers bloom on 18" scapes and are a beautiful bell-shape.



Varietaged Hosta

(Undulata albo)

As one of the first hostas to come up in the spring it has medium green leaves with wavy, white margins and gray-green streaks at the junction of the margin and center. Note that this Hosta may lose its variegation temporarily if in a potted container, during the hottest part of the season. It has pale lavender flowers appearing on 31-45" scapes in midsummer.

Variegated Hosta

(Ventricosa)

A Hosta with huge, glossy, leaves that are heart shaped with slightly twisted tips and a rich, green color. Medium-purple blooms with distinctive striping are shown atop 40" scapes in midsummer. This Hosta has numerous pods filled with fertile seeds that are produced after the flowers.



Wildlife Multi-Pack –

Plant pack contains 10 plants with two of each plant. Plants will be sold as dormant seedlings (6-12”).

Price: \$20.00 per packet

Swamp White Oak

(Quercus bicolor) **Native**

A tree with an average growth rate that does best in sunny or at least partially shaded areas. Reaches 50 to 70 feet. As the name suggests, swamp white oak does best in poorly drained soils, but it can be planted on moderately well drained soils as well. Provides nut crop for wildlife.



American Hazelnut

(Corylus americana) **Native**

Moderate growth rate, up to 10 feet. Prefers sun to partial shade and rich, moist, well-drained soils. Cultivated for nut production. Also provides habitat and food to wildlife. Broadly oval deciduous leaves.

Ninebark

(Physocarpus opulifolius)

Native

This species can grow from 5 to 10 feet tall. It does well in a wide range of moisture conditions. It produces small white or pink flowers in late spring to early summer. Which are great for pollinators such as butterflies.



American Plum

(Prunus americana) **Native**

Wild Plums can be eaten fresh, canned, and preserved in jams for human consumption. Turkeys, foxes, and songbirds eat the fruit as well. It is recommended as a drought resistance, erosion control plant and for creating wildlife habitat. Wild plum can grow to a height of 24 feet and has white flower clusters in April/May and fruit in August.

Red Osier Dogwood

(Cornus sericea) **Native**

Moderate growth rate, but quick to establish, commonly grows from 3-10 feet. Is adapted to growing well in moist soils (especially along streams), and can grow in any amount of shade. White flowers bloom in March-May, and red branches retain their color throughout the year. Great for erosion control.



Wild Berry Multi-Pack –

Plant pack contains 10 plants with three elderberry and native raspberry and two shadblow serviceberry and red mulberry. Plants will be sold in dormant seedlings (6-12").

Price: \$22.00 per packet

Elderberry

(Sambucus nigra) **Native**
Rapid growth rate up to 7 feet. Prefers well drained to poorly drained soils and sunlight to shade. Berries used by humans and wildlife. Attracts pollinating insects. Blooms white flowers in June and July followed by dark purple berries.



Shadblow (Downy) Serviceberry

(Amelanchier canadensis) **Native**
Slow growth rate, up to 25 feet. Prefers moderately drained to poorly drained soils in partial to full shade. At least 40 different song bird species are known to feed on its fruit. Blooms white flower in March-May.



Native Raspberry

(Rubus odoratus) **Native**
Rapid growth rate, up to 4 feet. Prefers moist, well-drained soils with full sun. The berries are primarily used as a food resource for humans and wildlife. White flowers bloom from May to July and the juicy red berries ripen around in July.



Red Mulberry

(Morus rubra) **Native**
Moderate growth rate up to about 50 feet. Can tolerate both well drained and somewhat poorly drained soils in shade or sun. This tree is a favorite of both large and small game for its distinctive red/purple berries that resemble blackberries.

This is a rain or shine event! To ensure you can receive the selections you want we recommend pre-ordering. For those that miss the pre-order deadline visit the Overstock Sale, noting that not all species may be available at that time. We sell to our customers on a first come, first served basis.

All seedlings are bare root. Stock may be used for wildlife habitat, erosion control, reforestation, windbreaks, landscaping, Christmas trees, etc. All trees and shrubs sold are to be used for the above conservation practices. All trees and shrubs are sold with the understanding that they will not be removed from the planted site with roots attached for resale. Orders are filled on a first-come, first-serve basis, while supplies last. The District reserves the right to refund payment on species and items if they should become unavailable. Because the District cannot check a planting location, nor guard against improper handling and planting procedures or weather related problems, the District will not be responsible for replacement or refunds of orders after distribution. Returned checks WILL NOT be reprocessed. Bounced checks will incur a \$20 fee.

In such situations, the only forms of payment accepted will be money order, cash, or credit card.

***Credit card refunds will be subject to a 5% administrative fee deducted from the total amount of purchase.**
